# NASTAR National Championships

Nine Dutchmen attended the Nastar National Championships in Steamboat Colorado from March 23 - 26. We all agreed that the courses that Steamboat set were the toughest we had raced all season. The courses had a very steep pitch with tight turns and a firm icy base. There were lots of crashes and if you got late, you got spit out. In the snowboard division, Jim and Kelly Kondisko each won gold medals in their age group. By winning their age group, they also won official Descente Nastar Race suits and an invitation to compete in the Race of Champions on Sunday for the National Title. For the skiers in their respective age group divisions, Chris Price won a medal with Brian Muller right on his heels in 4th and Lisa Draper won a silver medal. In my opinion, everyone deserves a medal for just finishing the courses. In the finals race on Sunday, Jim Kondisko beat out everyone in the men's snowboard division to be crowned the Nastar Snowboard National Champion. Kelly Kondisko had a very competitive field of women snowboarders and placed 2nd in the finals race. Kelly got an added bonus in the door prize drawings by winning an Accutron watch. Sweet!! We got to meet and have our pictures taken with all the US ski team athletes who graciously signed our race bibs. It was really exciting to meet Billy Kidd, who when I said I was from the Flying Dutchmen Ski club said, "I know the Flying Dutchmen. They are one of the biggest ski clubs in the country." He also remembered coming to a FDSC function at one time. After meeting Billy, we ran into another past FDSC member named Marion Gibson who lives in Steamboat. She was a member years ago who also taught at Heidelberg and was very happy to hear how well the club was doing.

After the championships on Sunday, a few of us decided to take a few runs from the top. Weather had been good and bad throughout the day and we were warned of high winds and low visibility at the peak but we went up anyway. When we arrived at the peak, the wind was blowing at least 60mph and there was no visibility. The snow was pelting and we could not even find the trail to go down. We pressed on trying to find the trail fighting the wind. We found the tree line along the trail and tried to head down along the side. The wind was blowing up the trail so hard that if you faced the wind, you could not take a breath. It would suck the air from your chest. We struggled down the mountain trying not to lose sight of each other. Finally, we made it to the clear, and all agreed that we felt like we had just skied Mt. Everest conditions.

Overall, we had a great time at Nastar Finals. We made some new friends with fellow racers, had fun times at the parties in the square after the races, and took home some cool swag. Bear Creek was very well represented with three racers placing in the Sunday championships.





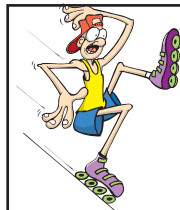
